

## Recreational Opportunities

Bird Watching – Bicycling – Camping  
Fishing – Hiking – Horseback Riding – Hunting  
Outdoor Photography – Wildlife Viewing

*Conservation Areas are closed from 10 p.m. to 4 a.m. except for authorized camping, fishing and hunting, and dog training activities.*

- No littering. No waste containers are provided. All trash should be removed from the area.
- No fireworks.
- No open fires except in designated areas. All fires must be attended at all times.
- Dogs must be leashed when not used for training or hunting. Special-use permits are required for field and retriever trials.
- Nuts, berries, fruits, mushrooms and wild greens may be taken for personal use. Cutting or removing other vegetation is prohibited.
- Motor vehicles are allowed on public roadways and in parking areas.
- Horseback riding is allowed on roads open to vehicles and on designated trails or by special-use permit. Commercially-operated trail rides are prohibited.
- Primitive camping is permitted in spots designated on the area map and with a special-use permit issued by the area manager. Contact the Southwest Regional Office at (417) 895-6880.
- Bicycling is allowed on service roads, roads open to vehicles, and designated trails.
- For safety reasons target shooting is permitted only at the shooting range. Rifle range is closed every Monday for maintenance.
- Caving and rappelling are not allowed.

## Fishing and Boating

*Fishing and frogging are allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Bullfrogs and green frogs may not be taken with firearms.

- Seining or trapping live bait, including tadpoles, is prohibited.

## Hunting and Trapping

*Hunting is allowed under statewide regulations with the following exceptions:*

- Deer hunting is permitted under statewide seasons and methods except: only archery and muzzleloading methods may be used.
- Portable tree stands may be used between Sept. 1 and Jan. 31. Stands must be identified with the name and address, or conservation number of the user. Screw-in steps or other materials that would damage the tree are prohibited.
- Furbearer trapping is permitted by special-use permit.

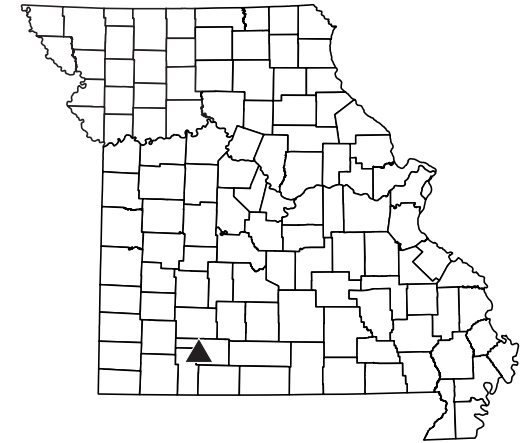
Busiek State Forest and Wildlife Area is on Highway 65 eighteen miles south of Springfield.
